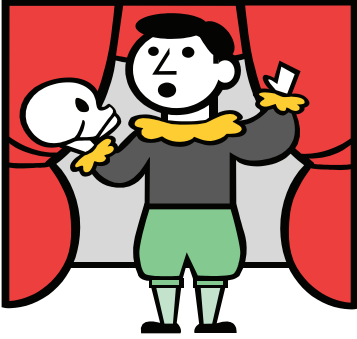


The Green Room Summer Shakespeare Theatre Institute



The Green Room Summer Shakespeare Theatre Institute is a week-long day camp in which students in all grades explore the exciting world of William Shakespeare and his times. Then they participate in a production of one of his plays! Using the Bard (Shakespeare) as a guide, participants learn more about **acting, auditioning skills, costumes, scenery, how to memorize, mask making, lights, make-up**, becoming a **character** on the stage, and working as an **ensemble**. These are key elements to becoming a better performer (and it can help with English classes, too).

This year we are taking on one of Shakespeare's most magical plays, *The Tempest*, and we are giving it a Polynesian twist by setting it in the Hawaiian Islands. This will result in a week in which we not only discover more about one of Shakespeare's most beloved works, but also learn a little more about the history, culture, and folk lore behind the islands of the Pacific.



Exploring this play through history, culture, and text, the students will gain a new perspective on acting, comedy, and character! We will be working on all different levels so that everyone will come to a better understanding of the play, Shakespeare, and the stage.

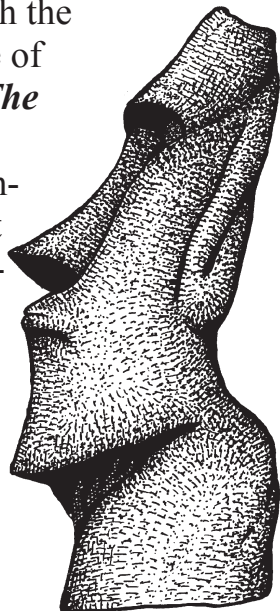
THE

CAMP MEETS FROM 10AM - 3PM MONDAY - SATURDAY

A typical day of Summer Shakespeare Theatre Institute will include...

10 AM SHAKE UP YOUR MORNING!

Wake up each day to the morning show that is full of crazy stories, kooky competitions, and a trip to CAMP SHAKAWAKA!



10:30 SMALL GROUP TIME

Grouped by AGE, Small Group Time provides campers with a chance to work on projects, explore history, and discuss the themes of the play on a level just right for each person!

11AM REHEARSAL BLOCK

Once cast in a role, the Rehearsal Block is where young actors put their skills to the test. Working with a director, campers will learn blocking, character development, and other acting skills that ultimately lead up to their part in the Final Performance.



12PM LUNCH BREAK

Bring a bag lunch and enjoy a quick picnic before heading back to camp!

12:20 COOL DOWN AND FOCUS

After a quick break for lunch, campers experience basic cool down and centering techniques to focus themselves and prepare them for performance!



12:30 WORKSHOP

Each day campers will take part in a unique workshop that touches on a different skill that complements the week. From Choreography and Team Building to Mask Making, Workshop is a chance to learn and have fun!



1:30 REHEARSAL BLOCK II

Next, the actors return to their directors for more work on their specific scene.

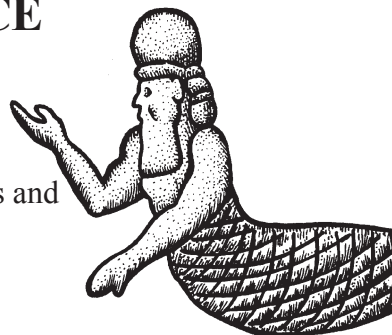
2:30 SMALL REGROUP TIME

Back once more with their Small Group, campers have an opportunity to reflect on the day's activities.

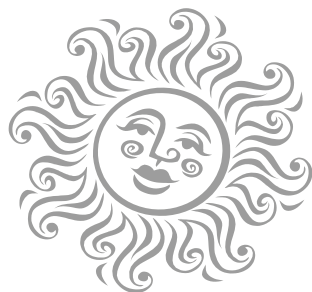
FINAL PERFORMANCE
